

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




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place the tracks on their respective bedrails and mark the positions of the most rearward clamps prior to removing the liner. (The correct position of the BEDLINER track is with the black plastic track end-cap (2) 1/2" DIAMETER HOLES for drain hoses, located as required touching the inside surface of the tailqate.) Diagram 2 TAILGATE PANEL **3.** When the modification is

complete, push the wall of the liner under the bedrail.


4. Be sure to trim the bedliner's plastic tailgate panel as shown.

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Step 2: Notching Factory Bedrail Caps

Note: This modification is required to ensure proper functioning of the latching mechanism

A. Measure 3" from the outside edge of the bed post and place a vertical mark on the downflange of the bedrail cap (*Photo 3*). It is also advisable to mark a





horizontal cutting line along the top edge of the bedrail cap.

B. Slip a metal stake pocket cover between the bedrail cap and the painted bedrail to prevent scratching the paint when cutting *(Photos 4 and 5)*. Use a utility knife to notch the bedrail cap, and remember to always cut away from your body.



Step 3: Install the Housing

A. Place the housing assembly onto the bedrails (*Photo 6*). Center it between the bedrails and leave about ½" of space between the bulkhead and the back of the





housing. Do not fasten the housing in place.

B. Remove the lid from the housing (Photo 7) and discard the plastic packing bolts.


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
Step 4: Install the Tracks

A. Carefully place

the tracks on the bedrails (Photo 8) and key them onto the housing stems (Diagram 9), being sure that the handle is properly engaged into the tracks.



B. Attach the back clamps very loosely to the tracks to be sure that the tracks do not fall off of the bedrail while proceeding (Photo 10).



D. Attach the remaining clamps very loosely. Do not tighten yet.



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Step 5: Install the Tailgate Extrusion

- A. Remove the tailgate access panel.
- B. Using a tape measure, locate and mark the center of the tailgate (*Photo 12*).
- C. Using a tape measure, locate and mark the center of the tailgate extrusion *(Photo 12)*.
- D. While holding it square and centering the tailgate extrusion on the tailgate, use a #8 x ³/₄" self tapping screw and power screw gun to secure the center hole (Photo 12)


(Photo 13). Next, move to each end, press the tailgate extrusion to the top of the tailgate in order to make it conform to the contour of the tailgate, and secure it in place. (Photo 14)



- F. Replace the tailgate access panel over the tailgate extrusion flange (Photos 15 & 16).
- G. With the tailgate extrusion secured, carefully close the tailgate, being cautious not to strike the ends of the tracks.

Step 7: Installing the Lid, Cargo Bumper and Drain Tubes

A. Remove the plastic wing nut and detach the pull strap from the threaded stud (*Photo* 21). Pull the cover closed and latch it to the tailgate. Do not allow



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the cover to retract without the lid in place. If included, remove the packing filler from the housing (*Photo 22*).

Step 7: Installing the Lid, Cargo Bumper and Drain Tubes

- B. Place the lid onto the housing flanges (*Photo 23*), and secure it in place with ¼ 20 x 5/8" black countersunk screws. Do not use a power or pneumatic screw gun.
- C. With the lid secured in place, you may test operate the *ROLL-N-LOCK*[®] cover. The cover should retract on its own with only a slight push from the tailgate end. When pulled closed, it should latch effortlessly.
- D. Use ¼ 20 x ½" truss head screws and rubber washers to secure the cargo bumper (Photo 24). Note that the rubber washers go on the inside of the cargo

- E. Use a ½" bit to drill holes for the drain tubes (*Photo 26*).
 Note that this process is easier if a ¼" pilot hole is drilled first. Align the holes with the drain tube fittings and locate them about 3"-4" below the housing.
 - F. Make sure the pull-strap is securely clipped to a fixed point in the bed.



Step 8: Place the Hang Tag on Review Mirror
