Introduction:

- This installation requires a professional mechanic!
- We recommend that you have access to a factory service manual to assist in the disassembly and reassembly of your vehicle. It contains a wealth of detailed information.
- Prior to installation, carefully inspect the vehicle's steering and driveline systems paying close attention to the tie rod ends, ball joints, wheel bearing preload, pitman and idler arms. Additionally, check steering-to-frame and suspension-to-frame attaching points for stress cracks. The overall vehicle must be in excellent working condition. Repair or replace all worn or damaged parts!
- Read the instructions carefully and study the illustrations before attempting installation! You may save yourself a lot of extra work.
- Check the parts and hardware against the parts list to assure that your kit is complete. Separating parts according to the areas where they will be used and placing the hardware with the brackets before you begin will save installation time.
- Check the special equipment list and ensure the availability of these tools.
- Secure and properly block vehicle prior to beginning installation.
- <u>ALWAYS</u> wear safety glasses when using power tools or working under the vehicle!
- Use caution when cutting is required under the vehicle. The factory undercoating is flammable. Take appropriate precautions. **Have a fire extinguisher close at hand.**
- Foot pound torque readings are listed on the Torque Specifications chart at the end of the instructions. These are to be used unless specifically directed otherwise. Apply thread lock retaining compound where specified.
- Please note that while every effort is made to ensure that the installation of your Pro Comp lift kit is a positive experience, variations in construction and assembly in the vehicle manufacturing process will virtually ensure that some parts may seem difficult to install. Additionally, the current trend in manufacturing of vehicles results in a frame that is highly flexible and may shift slightly on disassembly prior to installation. The use of pry bars and tapered punches for alignment is considered normal and usually does not indicate a faulty product. However, if you are uncertain about some aspect of the installation process, please feel free to call our tech support department at the number listed on the cover page. We do not recommend that you modify the Pro Comp parts in any way as this will void any warranty expressed or implied by the Pro Comp Suspension company.

Please Note:

- ⇒ Front suspension and head light realignment is <u>necessary!</u>
- ⇒ Speedometer and ABS recalibration will be necessary if larger tires (10% more than stock diameter) are installed.
- ⇒ IT IS ADVISABLE THAT YOU HAVE HELP AVAILABLE WHEN INSTALLING THIS KIT. SOME COMPONENTS ARE HEAVY AND AWKWARD. AN ADDITIONAL SET OF HANDS IS GOOD INSURANCE AGAINST INJURY!


Installation Instructions:


- Position your vehicle on a smooth, flat, hard surface (i.e. concrete or asphalt).
 Block the rear tires and set the emergency brake.
- 2. Using a floor jack support the transmission tail shaft.
- Unbolt the transmission crossmember side braces if vehicle is so equipped.
 Save braces and hardware for reinstallation.
- 4. Unbolt the exhaust heat shield from the vehicle if vehicle is so equipped. Save for reinstallation.
- 5. Unbolt the exhaust loop from the crossmember if vehicle is so equipped.
- Unbolt the compression struts from the compression strut brackets. Save hardware for reinstallation.
- 7. Unbolt the compression strut brackets

- from the transmission crossmember. Save the bolts and washers, but discard the old nut plates.
- 8. Unbolt the (4) bolts attaching the transmission to the crossmember. Save the hardware for reinstallation.
- 9. Unbolt the (4) bolts attaching the transmission crossmember to the frame rails and remove the crossmember from the vehicle.
- 10. Install the previously removed compression strut brackets to the new crossmember (90-5317) using the previously removed 1/2" X 1 1/2" bolts, washers and new supplied nut plates (90-5321). See ILLUSTRATION 1.

4WD Installation Steps:

11. Raise the transmission crossmember (90-5317) into place and line up the holes in





the crossmember with the **OE** holes in the frame. Secure using the previously removed **OE** bolts and hardware. See IL-LUSTRATION 1.

- 12. Secure the transmission to the crossmember using the previously removed **OE** bolts. See ILLUSTRATION 1.
- 13. Reinstall the exhaust/driveshaft shield bracket to the crossmember (90-5317) using the (2) supplied 5/16" X 1" bolts and washers. See ILLUSTRATION 1.
- 14. Reinstall the exhaust loop to the crossmember (90-5317) using the supplied 5/16" X 1" bolt and washer if previously removed. See ILLUSTRATION 1.
- 15. Torque the crossmember bolts to 30 ft./ lbs. Torque the transmission mount bolts to 14 ft./lbs.


2WD Installation Steps:


16. Install the transmission bracket (90-5362)

to the transmission using the previously removed **OE** transmission bolts and hardware. Torque the transmission mount bolts to 14 ft./lbs. See ILLUSTRATION 2.

NOTE: The notch in the bracket will be facing toward the front of the vehicle.

17. Raise the transmission crossmember (90-5317) into place and line up the holes in the crossmember with the OE holes in the





frame. Secure using the previously removed **OE** bolts and hardware. See IL-LUSTRATION 2.

- 18. Secure the transmission bracket (90-5362) to the transmission crossmember (90-5317) using the supplied 7/16" X 4 1/2" bolts and hardware. See ILLUSTRATION 2.
- 19. Torque the crossmember bolts to 30 ft./ lbs. Torque the **7/16**° transmission bracket bolts to 60 ft./lbs.

For Both 2WD & 4WD Installations:

20. Reinstall the previously removed transmission crossmember side braces. Use the supplied **5/16**" **X 1**" bolts and hardware to secure the front of the braces to the new crossmember. Use the previously removed **OE** bolts to secure the rear of the braces to the frame. See ILLUSTRATION 3.

- 21. Reinstall the compression strut to the compression strut mount using the previously removed 1/2" X 4" bolt and hardware.
- 22. Torque the transmission skid plate, exhaust loop, and driveshaft/exhaust shield bracket and compression strut hardware according to the torque on page 7.
- 23. Unbolt the rear driveshaft carrier bearing from the frame. Insert the carrier bearing spacer bracket (90-5323) between the frame and the bearing housing. See IL-LUSTRATION 4.
- 24. Secure the spacer bracket (90-5323) to the frame using the previously removed **OE** bolts. Secure the carrier bearing to the spacer bracket using the supplied 7/16" X 1 1/4" bolts and hardware. See ILLUSTRATION 4.

NOTES:

- ⇒ After 100 miles recheck for proper torque on all newly installed hardware.
- ⇒ Recheck all hardware for tightness after off road use.

Use this only as a guide for hardware without a called out torque specification in the instruction manual.
