

43135 - Vehicle Wiring Installation Instructions Honda Accord 2 Dr. 2003-05

- 1. Open trunk and remove threshold panel. Partially remove the felt trunk liner on the driver's side and passenger's side exposing the taillight wiring.
- 2. Separate the taillight harness connectors, being careful not to break the locking tabs.
- 3. The taillight wiring harness will have connection points matching the ends of the Hopkins[®] T-connector with converter module.
- 4. On the driver's side, insert the T-Connector end, with the yellow wire, between the vehicle wiring connectors and lock into place. Next insert the T-Connector end, with the red wire, between the vehicle wiring connectors and lock into place. Ensure that the connectors are fully inserted with locking tabs in place.
- 5. On the driver's side, secure the converter module in the taillight area using ny-ties. (Provided)
- 6. On the driver's side, route the T-Connector end with the green wire to the passenger's side along the threshold and behind the trunk liner. Disconnect the vehicle wiring harness from the taillight socket. Plug the Hopkins[®] T-Connector end with the green wire in-between the mating plugs on the passenger's side taillight socket and vehicle wiring harness.
- 7. Locate a suitable position on the vehicle frame close to the connector to attach the convertor's white wire with the ring terminal. Drill a 3/32" hole and attach the white wire to the vehicle using the screw provided. Caution: Do not drill into any exposed surfaces or through the vehicle body exterior.
- 8. Re-install the trunk liner and reattach the threshold panel.
- 9. Route the 4-way flat harness to either side of the receiver hitch.
- 10. Attach the 4-way flat dust cover (provided) to the 4-way flat connector.
- 11. Apply a small amount of grease (provided) to the 4-way flat terminals to prevent corrosion.
- 12. Plug completed wire harness into the trailer 4-way flat connector.
- 13. Test all functions with the engine running to ensure proper operation.
- 14. Store 4-flat in trunk area when not in use.

TIPS:

Grease applied to the trailer wiring terminals on a regular basis will help prevent corrosion.

A heavy duty flasher may be required to eliminate rapid flashing.

Always unplug boat trailer connector before backing trailer into the water.
