

NOTE: Carefully read entire instructions thoroughly before attempting to install this part. Photos are for illustration purposes and actual product may vary. Install remains the same

It is highly recommended that the install takes place when temperatures are above 75°. This allows the fabric to stretch easier, as cold fabric can contract up to 1''-2''. We highly recommend laying the skins in direct sunlight or a warm place for 1-2 hours before you attempt the install.



Note: If your existing door skins were not held in place with Velcro, you will be required to cut them off Use caution when removing old door skins.

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Step 1: Identify a suitable location. A table covered with a soft blanket or towel should be used to avoid scratching the windows. Lay out door skin and un-zip window completely. Note the corner and number they follow in the install sequence. We will start a the bottom door edge and work your way around the door frame in a counter-clockwise direction. Install rear corner first making sure the contour of the skin is filled with the door frame tubing. Fig A & B. Door frame should fit between the Velcro flaps, not between zipper and flaps.



<u>Step 2:</u> Slide the front lower corner of the door frame into the skin. Make sure the skin does not hang up on the door frame, this should install fairly easily. If it is difficult, you may have part of the fabric catching on the door frame. Fig C & D.



<u>Step 3</u>: Work the fabric over the front edge of the door frame.





Step 4: Now move to the top rear corner. It is easier to work your way up each part slightly till you get to the corner, when it gets difficult, concentrate on the back edge, you can pull on the small tab slightly to aid in pulling the fabric over the frame. There is a small pull tab to help work the fabric over the front edge of the door frame. You use a wooden spoon or shoe horn to help get the last part of the fabric over the frame. Make sure you only pull on the fabric and NOT the weather stripping. Fig E&F.







Step 5: Secure the bottom flaps around the door frame on back on to skin, then secure the top flaps on the ones you just folded up. Make sure you pull up firmly on the bottom flaps as they control the tension of the fabric. As fabric stretches over time , it will get easier to adjust these. Fig g, H, and I

Note: Door frames may seem rigid but may have flexed out of optimum position during door skin install. Install upper door into lower door. Check all sealing surfaces. Adjust upper door for a tight fit. Manipulation of upper door frame can be done by carefully bending frame for a tight fit.



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Step 1: Identify a suitable location. A table covered with a soft blanket or towel should be used to avoid scratching the windows. Lay out door skin and un-zip window completely. Note the corner and number they follow in the install sequence. We will start a the rear top corner and work our way around the door frame in a counter-clockwise direction. Install top rear corner first making sure the contour of the skin is filled with the door frame tubing. Fig 1 & 2. Door frame should fit between the Velcro flaps, not between zipper and flaps. Corners 1 then 2 can pretty much be installed at the same time with 1 slightly before you start corner 2.





Step 2: Slide the rear lower corner of the door frame into the skin. Make sure the skin does not hang up on the door frame, this should install fairly easily. If it is difficult, you may have part of the fabric catching on the door frame. Fig 2.

Step 3: Work the fabric over the front edge of the door frame. Its easiest to have the frame sitting higher than the pocket, pull on tab at the corner of pocket and once the fabric clears the door frame tip, side the tip into the skin. Fig 3





Step 4: Now move to the top front corner. It is easier to work your way up each part slightly till you get to the corner, when it gets difficult, concentrate on pulling up the very tip of the corner evenly. You may use a wooden spoon or shoe horn to help get the last part of the fabric over the frame. Make sure you only pull on the fabric and NOT the weather stripping. Fig 4.



Step 5: Secure the bottom flaps around the door frame on back on to skin, then secure the top flaps on the ones you just folded up. Make sure you pull up firmly on the bottom flaps as they control the tension of the fabric. As fabric stretches over time, it will get easier to adjust these. Fig 5+6.

<u>Step 6</u>: install door frame into upper door, then attach skin plastic retainer into the channel on the door.
