


Remove the components from the box, verify if all parts listed are present and free from damage.

Note: It is recommended that anti-seize lubricant is used on all stainless steel fasteners to prevent thread damage and galling.

ELECTRICAL COMPONENT INSTALLATION PROCEDURE

- 1. Begin by disconnecting the battery from the vehicle. Start with the negative battery terminal, then the positive battery terminal.
- 2. On both the driver and passenger side of the vehicle, remove the front door sill trim panel, A-Pillar kick panel, and the B-Pillar trim panel by carefully pulling on the panels enough to release them from the plastic retaining clips. See **Figures 1 through 3** for reference.
- 3. With the panels removed, pull the front driver side carpet back. Cut a 7/16" opening into the rubber grommet shown, and feed the door trigger signal white and brown wires and the two black manual switch wires into the cab of the vehicle. See **Figures 4 & 5** for reference. <u>Note:</u> To avoid possible water intrusion, it is recommended to use RTV Silicone Adhesive to seal the opening once the wires are fed into the cab.













- 4. Route the brown door trigger wire to the driver side B-Pillar, and the white door trigger wire under the front driver side carpet, the center console, the front passenger side carpet, and to the passenger side B-Pillar.
- 5. With the B-Pillar panels removed, locate the seat belt assembly on the driver's side and loosen the top bolt shown. Locate the Magnetic Induction Module (Item 9) and mount the ground wire fork under the top bolt of the seat belt assembly to provide a ground connection for the Magnetic Induction Module. Once grounded, connect the snap-in bullet connector on the module to the brown trigger wire previously routed to the driver side B-Pillar. See **Figure 6 through 8** for reference.
- 6. Prepare the "sticking" surfaces on both sides of the B-Pillar by using a damp rag with a mix of isopropyl alcohol and water to clean the surface. Once the surface is completely dry, remove the backing from the Magnetic Induction Module, and "stick" them onto both sides of the B-Pillar as shown in **Figures 9 & 10.** <u>Note:</u> Pay close attention to where the Magnetic Induction Modules are placed on the door jambs of the vehicle.
- 7. Using a measuring tape and masking tape, take reference of where the Magnetic Induction Modules have been placed on the front driver side door jamb and rear driver side door jamb so that the magnets can be placed accordingly on the door strikers. Once a reference point has been taken, place the reference masking tape onto the driver side door striker and rear driver side door striker, respectively, and prepare the surface on the door strikers by using a damp rag with a mix of isopropyl alcohol and water to clean the surface. Once the surface is completely dry, peel the backing from the magnets and "stick" them to the reference location on the door striker. See **Figures 11 & 12** for reference.
- 8. Repeat **Steps 5 through 7** for the white trigger wire that was previously routed to the passenger side B-Pillar.

 Note: Pay attention to measurements and positions shown for the Magnetic Induction Module and magnets. The magnet must align with the corresponding module sensor to ensure the motor linkages function properly. If the boards are not deploying once all of the wiring is connected, inspect and ensure that the magnets align with their corresponding module sensor.















- 9. Locate the manual switch (Item 8) and prepare the desired mounting surface by using a damp rag with a mix of isopropyl alcohol and water to clean the surface. Once the surface is dry, mount the manual switch to the desired location by removing the backing from the double sided tape and applying pressure to "stick" the switch onto the desired surface. See **Figure 13** for reference. *Note:* It is recommended that the manual switch is in an accessible location on the driver's side lower dash panel.
- 10. Route the two black manual switch wires to the manual switch. Connect the two wires and neatly tuck or zip tie the extra wiring away so that the switch cannot be tugged or pulled accidentally.
- 11. Moving back to the wiring underneath the vehicle, route the two fused power wires towards the front of the vehicle. Pull back the driver side fender liner and feed the fused power wires into the engine compartment. Remove the two fuses from both of the fused power wires and leave them disconnected from the battery. See **Figures 14 & 15** for reference.











- 12. Route the electrical harness to the designated locations of the control module and motor linkages. Route the corresponding male connector plug to where the corresponding female connector will be per the labeling on the harness. For example, the male connector labeled "Front Left," will be routed to the front driver side of the vehicle, and the "Front Right" should be routed to the front passenger side of the vehicle. The male connectors for the control module will be routed to the center drivers side. See **Figures 16 through 19** for reference. Note: The mounting brackets with the female connectors, and the Control Module (Item 6) will be installed after the wiring is routed. For now, the male connectors are only routed to the corresponding locations.
- 13. Locate the LED Lights (Item 11). Align the arrow from the LED Light male connector to the arrow on the female connector or on the main wiring harness. Prepare the designated mounting surface on the vehicle frame rail or on the body of the vehicle by cleaning it with the provided alcohol wipes, and allow the surface to dry completely before peeling the backing off of the double sided tape and "sticking the LED lights to the designated mounting surface. See **Figures 20 through 22** for reference.




















MECHANICAL COMPONENT INSTALLATION PROCEDURE


- 14. Starting on the driver side of the vehicle, locate the mounting locations with the factory threaded holes. They will either have screws or caps installed from the factory. Remove the factory screws or caps from the threaded holes. *Note:* Factory screws will not be used again.
- 15. Locate and loosely install the Front Motor Linkage (Item 2) to the front rocker panel mounting location using the supplied M8 hardware as shown in **Figures 23 & 24.** Please refer to **Figure 25** for bracket orientation and locations.
- 16. Loosely install the Control Module Assembly (Item 6) to the center mounting location on the rocker panel using the supplied M10 hardware as shown in **Figure 26**. Please refer to **Figure 25** for bracket orientation and locations.
- 17. Loosely install the Rear Motor Linkage (Item 4) to the rear rocker panel mounting location using the supplied M10 hardware as shown in **Figures 27 & 28.** Please refer to **Figure 25** for bracket orientation and locations.


<u>Note:</u> The motor linkages are etched, and call out the corresponding mounting location to help aid with linkage placement.

















- 18. With assistance, loosely install one of the running board assemblies (Item 1) to the driver side of the vehicle. Position the board on the front and rear motor assembly bases, and align the sliding T-Nut on the running board with the corresponding slots on the front and rear motor bases. Once the T-Nuts are aligned, slightly rotate the running board to allow the T-Nuts to set into the slots on the motor bases. See **Figure 29 & 30** for reference.
- 19. Repeat Steps 14 through 15, and 17 through 18 for the passenger side of the vehicle.
- 20. Align and adjust the both the motor linkage assemblies and the driver and passenger side running boards to the desired positioning. Use the supplied hex socket cap screws (Item 13) to secure the running board to the motor linkage arms. See **Figure 30** for reference.
- 21. Once all of the components have been adjusted to the desired positioning, fully tighten and torque all hardware as specified: M6 hardware to 8-9 ft-lbs., M8 hardware to 15-18 ft-lbs., and M10 hardware to 35-38 ft-lbs.






- 22. Locate and connect the previously routed male connectors from the main wiring harness to the female connectors on each motor linkage assembly. As mentioned previously, the male connector labeled "Front Left" will be connected to the female connector on the front driver side motor linkage, and the "Front Right" male connector should be connected to the female connector on the front passenger side motor linkage. See **Figures 31 & 32** for reference.
- 23. Locate and connect the previously routed four conductor plug, six conductor plug, black two conductor plug, and red two conductor plug to the control module located on the center driver side of the vehicle. See **Figure 33** for reference.
- 24. With all of the motor linkages, LED Lights, and control module plugs securely connected, return to the two control input wires in the engine compartment. Carefully connect the positive (red wire) to the positive battery terminal and the negative (black wire) to the negative battery terminal. Once the wires are connected to the battery, reinstall the previously removed fuses and neatly tuck away all of the wiring using the provided zip ties (Item 16). See **Figure 34** for reference.









- 25. With all of the wiring connectors securely plugged in, open the driver side door and ensure that the manual switch is in the off position. This signals the control module to retract and it will disable the operation of the running boards until it switched to the on position.
- 26. Open and close all of the vehicles doors one by one to ensure that the running boards operate appropriately. If the running boards operate properly, the installation is complete. If they do not, check all the wiring connections and make sure that the magnets on the door striker align with their corresponding control module. Note: Any misalignment between the magnets on the door strikers and their corresponding Magnetic Control Module can prevent the running boards from opening and closing properly.
- 27. With the running boards operating properly, neatly tuck away all of the wiring using the provided zip ties (Item 16).
